Subject	Italian: Second Language	
Title of task	Gli oggetti nell'astuccio (Items in the pencil case)	
Task details		
Description of task	Students demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of vocabulary, language structures and grammatical items related to their favourite things in the classroom. In Part A and Part B they also demonstrate their skills in comprehending spoken text and respond by circling the correct item heard and colouring it in the correct colour. In Part C they demonstrate their skills in speaking Italian by naming stationery items as they place them in a pencil case.	
Type of assessment	Summative	
Purpose of assessment	This assessment aims to determine student learning at the time of the assessment. It establishes information on the students' ability to comprehend spoken text and respond by locating and conveying or demonstrating the information in writing or in actions. It also establishes information on their ability to speak in Italian exchanging information on pencil case items.	
Assessment type	Short response – listen for information in spoken text Oral performance – participate in an oral activity	
Evidence to be collected	Completed task sheet Audio visual recording of interview

Communicating

Interact with the teacher and peers, using simple modelled language and gestures to share information about themselves, their age, where they live and to talk about their favourite things

Respond to teacher talk and instruction

Locate key words and information in simple spoken and written texts such as charts, lists, labels and captions, rhymes and songs related to their personal worlds

Share with others simple Italian expressions, sounds and gestures, name familiar objects and use Italian and/or English to conduct simple conversations

Understanding

Recognise and reproduce the sounds and intonation patterns of the Italian language noticing similarities and differences with English

Notice and use context-related vocabulary and some first elements of grammar to generate language for a range of purposes, including:

- noticing definite and indefinite articles with nouns, for example, *la matita*, *il libro*, *il quaderno*; *una maestra*, *uno studente*; *i ragazzi*, *le ragazze*
- noticing that Italian words end mostly with vowels to mark gender and number, for example, *fratello*, *sorella*, *libro*, *libri*

 observing that some words which do not end with a vowel are the same in English, for example, computer, robot, yogurt, sport. 		
 Students have prior knowledge of and exposure to: context-related vocabulary, including stationery items and colours some first elements of grammar, including: noticing definite and indefinite articles with nouns; noticing that Italian words end mostly with vowels to mark gender and number; observing that some words which do not end with a vowel are the same in English the textual conventions of an interview. 		
Teachers should differentiate their teaching and assessment to meet the specific learning needs of their students, based on their level of readiness to learn and their need to be challenged. Where appropriate, teachers may either scaffold or extend the scope of the assessment tasks.

Task is to be completed by students working individually.

Instructions for teacher

Prior to administering the task, the students will need to be:

- taught context-related vocabulary including classroom objects and colours
- taught some first elements of grammar, including:
 - noticing definite and indefinite articles with nouns
 - noticing that Italian words end mostly with vowels to mark gender and number
 - observing that some words which do not end with a vowel are the same in English.

Task

Part A: Gli oggetti

Students listen to the teacher read out the names of a set of stationery items. They circle the item that matches what they have heard.

Task administration script

Provide students with the task sheet.

Read the following statements to students, repeating each one twice.

Pause to allow for student response.

Le forbici.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

La gomma.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

La riga.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

Il temperamatite.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

Part B: Colorate

Students listen to the teacher read five statements. Students colour in the images according to the colour they hear.

Task administration script

READ ALOUD

Il temperamatite rosso.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

Le forbici viola.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

La gomma rosa.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

La riga gialla.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

READ ALOUD

Il quaderno verde.

Repeat the statement.

Pause to allow for student response.

Part C: Nell'astuccio

Prepare a tray of items found in a student's pencil case. Include a pencil case.

Individual students are asked to name and place as many items in the pencil case as they can in one minute.

READ ALOUD

Please look at the tray in front of you.

The tray has items from a pencil case in it.

I am going to put the timer on for one minute.

I would like you to name in Italian each item as you put it in the pencil case.

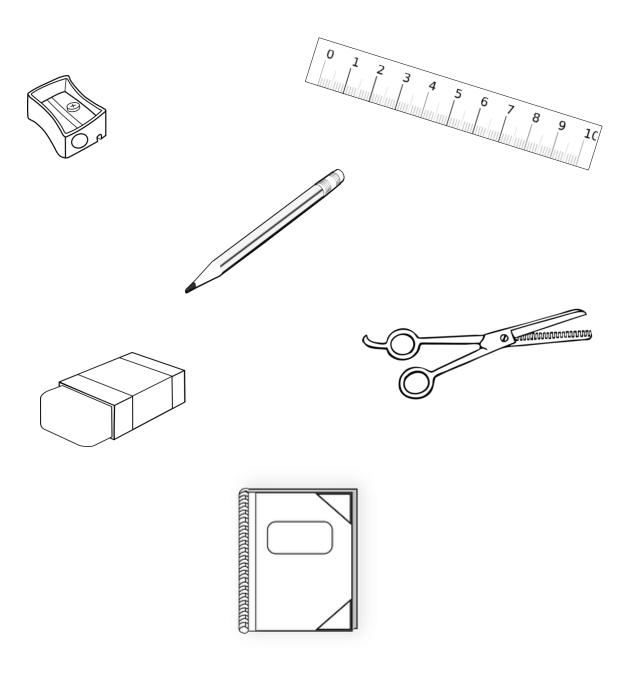
