Title of task	Hier wohne ich (I live here)
Task details	
Description of task	Students demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of vocabulary, language structures and grammatical items related to their home.
	In Part A they also demonstrate their skills in speaking German by initiating interactions with the teacher to exchange information about their home and where they live.
	In Part B they demonstrate their skills in drawing and labelling a floor plan and writing a descriptive paragraph about their home.
	In Part C they demonstrate their skills in comprehending written text and convey the similarities and differences between two homes in a Venn diagram.
Type of assessment	Summative
Purpose of assessment	This assessment aims to determine student learning at the time of the assessment. It establishes information on the students' ability to speak in German and exchange information about their home and where they live. It also establishes information on their ability to comprehend written German texts and write in German using simple descriptive language.

Content description

Understanding

Use context-related vocabulary and develop and apply knowledge of grammatical elements in simple spoken and written texts to generate language for a range of purposes, including:

- referring to a person, place or object using the nominative and accusative definite and indefinite articles, for example, Das Mädchen hat einen Hockeyschläger; Die Stadt hat ein Kino und eine Apotheke
- noticing how articles and pronouns change after certain verbs (*Ich danke dir*) and after particular prepositions associated with location, for example, Wir sind in der Stadt; Die Party ist bei Stefan im Garten
- understanding the concept of regular and irregular verbs and noticing that this is a feature of both German and English
- referring to quantities of people and things using cardinal numbers up to 10 000 including decimals, common fractions and negative numbers, for example, Meter; Kilometer; Quadratmeter; Quadratkilometer; 85,5 Prozent haben ein Handy; Die Tagestemperatur liegt bei minus 8 Grad; Ich habe eine Halbschwester

Recognise that spoken, written and multimodal German texts have certain conventions and can take different forms depending on the context in which they are produced.

Task preparation

Prior learning

Students have prior knowledge of and exposure to:

- a variety of texts related to home and neighbourhood
- context-related vocabulary
- grammatical structures, including referring to a place using definite and indefinite articles; regular and irregular features of verbs
- the textual conventions of a description.

Assessment differentiation

Teachers should differentiate their teaching and assessment to meet the specific learning needs of their students, based on their level of readiness to learn and their need to be challenged.

Where appropriate, teachers may either scaffold or extend the scope of the assessment tasks.

Prior to administering the task, the students need to be taught and exposed to:

- a variety of texts related to home and the neighbourhood
- context-related vocabulary
- grammatical structures, including:
 - referring to a place using definite and indefinite articles
 - regular and irregular features of verbs
- the textual conventions of a description, and provided with opportunities to practise them.

Task

Part A: Hier wohne ich

Provide students with Part A of the task.

Students are to draw and label in German the floor plan of their home.

The drawing can be done either as a floor plan or in front view.

Allow the students 40 minutes to complete this part of the task.

Part B: Mein Haus

Provide students with Part B of the task.

Students write a paragraph in German describing their home and where they live.

Allow students the use of a dictionary to look up unfamiliar words.

Allow the students 20 minutes to complete this part of the task.

Part C: Hier wohnen Johannes und Marianne

Provide students with Part C of the task.

Students read the texts in which Johannes und Marianne describe where they live.

Students then compare and contrast the information by using a Venn diagram.

Allow students the use of a dictionary to look up unfamiliar words.

Allow the students approximately 25 minutes to complete this part of the task.

Draw the floor plan or the front view of your home in the space below. Include all the rooms in the home and the garden. Label the rooms in German.

Part B: Mein Haus

Now that you have drawn and labelled your home, write a paragraph to describe it and where you live. In your writing use full sentences and correct punctuation. Look up any unfamiliar words in the dictionary. Aim to write 40 words.


