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The School Curriculum provides a high-quality curriculum for all Western Australian students.

All students are entitled to a high-quality education drawn from the Western Australian Curriculum Framework, regardless of the range of their interests and abilities. The curriculum is designed to meet the diverse needs of students and to provide opportunities for all students to learn and to achieve.

## Students with disabilities

The Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Discrimination Act 2005 require educational institutions to provide students with disabilities with the same opportunities as students without disabilities.



Many students with disabilities will learn in the same way as other students. However, some students may require additional support to ensure they can access the curriculum and participate in learning activities.



In some cases, curriculum modifications may be necessary to provide students with disabilities with the same opportunities as other students. These modifications may include providing additional support, modifying the curriculum, or providing alternative learning opportunities. The Western Australian Curriculum Framework provides guidance on how to make these modifications.
