Students with disabilities

The *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the *Disability Discrimination Act 2005* require educational institutions to provide education to students with disabilities without discrimination.

Many students with disabilities have the same capabilities as students without disabilities, and the way in which they learn is different.

In some cases, curriculum and assessment opportunities for students with disabilities may differ from the Australian Curriculum levels along the Pre-Primary to Year 12 continuum, depending on their capabilities learning needs and ability to adjust to the curriculum.
